## WHAT WE DO TO ENSURE EVENT SAFETY



School District Five of Lexington & Richland Counties is committed to the safety of students, spectators and school staff at district sporting events. Below are safety measures we utilize for winter sports events.



### ADMISSION

Admission will be charged upon entry and re-entry of the venue.



### STUDENT SUPERVISION

All students 8th grade or younger will still be required to attend games with parents or guardians.



### LAW ENFORCEMENT

School and district officials will continue to coordinate with law enforcement and school officials from opposing teams to ensure the safety of student athletes traveling to away games.



### EVENT ASSESSMENT

School and district officials complete pre-assessments of each event. Other safety measures, including metal detectors and bag checks, will be implemented as determined by safety assessments in coordination with law enforcement.

# Clear Bag / No Bag Requirements

Implementation Fall 2019

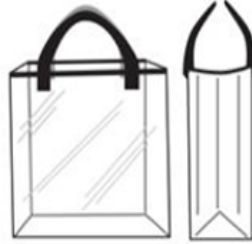


## APPROVED BAGS



### CLEAR TOTE BAG

Plastic, Vinyl or PVC and  
Do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"



### PLASTIC STORAGE BAG

Clear, one (1) gallon, re-sealable



### SMALL CLUTCH PURSE

Approximately the size of a hand with or without a handle or strap.

No larger than 4.5" x 6.5" with or without a hand or strap.

Can be carried separately or within an approved plastic bag.



Bags not allowed include: purses, bags or containers larger than a small clutch, backpacks, binoculars cases, briefcases, camera bags, cinch bags, coolers, diaper bags, fanny packs, grocery/trash bags, luggage of any kind, mesh bags, tinted plastic bags.
